Short presentation:

Rev. James Swetnam, S.J., was born in 1928. His early education was at a Catholic elementary school and at a Jesuit High school in St. Louis, Missouri, U.S.A. He entered the Society of Jesus in 1945 and was ordained priest in 1958. His academic degrees include a B.A. in Greek, a L.Phil. and M.S. in philosophy, an S.T.L. in theology, a L.S.S. in biblical studies, and a D.Phil. in biblical studies. From 1960 to 2010 he was a resident at the Pontifical Biblical Institute in Rome and Jerusalem first as student (1960-1962), then as faculty member (staff member 1962-1963, teacher 1963-1981, professor 1981-2003, professor emeritus 2003-2010). During the time as faculty member he was active in editing, teaching, administration, research and writing and represented the Biblical Institute in conferences in various parts of the world. During this time he was also active in teaching at Saint Louis University and The Paul VI Institute in St. Louis during the summer. From 1961 on he was also engaged in pastoral ministry, especially in the preaching of the Spiritual Exercises of St. Ignatius in the United States and other countries. He is a member of The Catholic Biblical Association and of The Society of New Testament Studies. He is now in residence at Jesuit Hall, 3601 Lindell Boulevard 63108-3393, St. Louis, Missouri, while remaining Professor Emeritus of the Pontifical Biblical Institute.
